

## Transition Programme for 2024 Cohort

Dear Parents/Carers

We are really looking forward to your child, joining us on our return to school on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2024 to start their new school career at Dronfield Henry Fanshawe School (DHFS). The school has a long and proud tradition of 'Success with Care' and we are excited about your child joining our family and being part of our future. As part of the transition process, we would like to invite you to our Y7 Induction Evening on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> July 2024 @ 6pm. There will be an opportunity to hear from our Headteacher, Mr Cooper, and other senior staff as well as to meet your child's House Team and mentor(s). The evening will give you all the information you need regarding our plans for your child's transition and answer any questions you may have regarding the summer and the start of the autumn term.

We intend to use the school website to communicate information that will be relevant to parents/carers regarding the transition process. Parents/carers are able to visit the 'Letters Home' section of our website (<https://dhfs.uk/letters-home/>) to find information that will be useful for when your child starts with us.

Please contact main reception should you need any of these documents printing.

You will also soon receive communication from school detailing your child's network username, password and email address to ensure a smooth start to life at DHFS. An information/help guide will accompany this so that parents/carers are able to troubleshoot and support with gaining access.

Now that all students have been allocated a place, you will have received a personalised letter advising you of your child's teaching group, house and mentor group.

We are pleased that this year we will be able to offer our traditional Induction Week between Monday 15<sup>th</sup> July – Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2024.

**Induction Week Essential Information:**

- Students can enter the site through any gate. We ask that parents/carers drop students off away from school to avoid traffic congestion. Students should be on site for 8:50am
- Students are to wear either a white T-shirt, white polo shirt or white formal shirt
- Sensible trousers or a formal knee length skirt should be worn. We ask that no shorts, non-dark tracksuit bottoms, jeans or leggings are worn for the week
- Students must bring equipment for the week including: pencil case, black or blue pen, ruler, pencil, rubber, protractor, compass
- Sensible footwear, if trainers, preferably black (no flip flops, pumps, ballet shoes, sandals). Trainers will not be allowed as part of school uniform in September
- PE kit will not be needed unless requested during the week
- A suitable bag to carry equipment, books and PE kit (if needed) is necessary
- Students will receive their Y7 timetable, a planner, a green pen and a house badge on Day 1

Our uniform suppliers Price & Buckland anticipate being fully stocked for uniform and PE kit. We encourage parents/carers to place their orders now in order to avoid unavailability. Sizing guidance is available on their website (<https://price-buckland.co.uk/school-uniform-online>). Alternatively, in order to tackle the rapidly growing global environmental challenges for a sustainable future, we aim to normalise the reusing of pre-loved school uniform to reduce our carbon footprint whilst helping our families in need of support. DHFS have teamed up with a company called Uniformd in order to try and make our environment a little greener. Support for Pupil Premium students with the cost of uniform is not available until later in the school year.
